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TOP TIPS



If you are currently on a work placement, consider asking your employer if you can allocate work time for training and/or ask for them to cover all or part of the cost. Explain how the training relates to your current role and future career goals.



If you are interested in a particular training organization, sign-up for their newsletter to receive updates on their upcoming opportunities.



Post-secondary student clubs, student organizations, and career offices often organize free and low-cost training sessions on a variety of topics. Check with your post-secondary institution and student union websites to learn more.



MOOCs (massive online open courses) are a great way to audit courses for free from universities both locally and across the globe. Students can also pay a fee to receive assignment feedback and certification.

Leading Change Forum | **Leading Change Canada**

Leading Change Canada provides opportunities for youth interested in environment and sustainability to come together, network, and discuss pressing climate issues. The Leading Change Forum is a conference held in Vancouver, BC, in conjunction with the GLOBE Forum (every two years), where global leaders from business, government, and civil society come together to manage risk and capitalize on opportunities in the clean economy. There is a registration fee which is highly subsidized. Financial support is available should the Leading Change event registration fee present a barrier to participation. To be eligible, applicants must be between 19-35 years of age on the day of the event.

RECONCILIATION & DECOLONIZATION

Indigenous Canada Course | University of Alberta

This course is from the Faculty of Native Studies and it explores the different histories and contemporary perspectives of Indigenous peoples living in Canada. From an Indigenous perspective, this course explores complex experiences Indigenous peoples face today from a historical and critical perspective highlighting national and local Indigenous-settler relations.

Land Back Course | Yellow Head Institute

This course will be a dynamic, community-focused approach that guides students through a self-directed learning experience loosely structured on the Land Back report. Students will learn about the denial of Indigenous self-determination but also the concept of consent and how it can be coerced, negotiated, or enforced. The course offers tangible examples of Indigenous-led strategies of consent-based jurisdiction.

Nahanee Creative

Nahanee Creative is a small dedicated team led by Squamish creative professionals. They centre Indigenous teachings, connection to land, and visual cultural sovereignty. They have a series of <u>on-demand workshops available</u> including: Cultural Protocols, Empathy, and Safety; Territorial Acknowledgements; Restorying Colonialism; Are you Serving it Right?; Introducing Decolonizing Practices; and Etiquette for Allies.

This course will help you envision how Indigenous histories, perspectives, worldviews, and approaches to learning can be made part of the work we do in classrooms, organizations, communities, and our everyday experiences in ways that are thoughtful and respectful. In this course, reconciliation emphasizes changing institutional structures, practices, and policies, as well as personal and professional ideologies to create environments that are committed to strengthening our relationships with Indigenous peoples.
