About the Student Work Placement Program (SWPP)

- Initiative funded in 2017 by Employment and Social Development Canada.
- Expanded in 2019 and again in 2020 due to the public health crisis.
- Connects employers, students, and post-secondary institutions.
- Creates (and sustains) quality work-integrated learning (WIL) opportunities.
- **Provides** employers with wage subsidies to hire students: 75% up to \$7,500.
- **Gives** students quality work experience so they can secure employment in their chosen fields of study.







Healthcare SWPP Placements

- Due to the current public health crisis caused by COVID-19, Employment and Social Development Canada -- the SWPP funder -- has confirmed an additional <u>1,500 healthcare</u> <u>placements</u> for the Magnet SWPP program:
 - 1. Any roles supporting healthcare faculties at postsecondary institutions.
 - 2. Any healthcare role at any organization.
 - 3. Any role (healthcare or non-healthcare) at an organization working in one of the following healthcare segments.

Criteria for Program Funding

Highlights...

- Employers are registered Canadian business, non-profit, postsecondary institution, hospital, or long-term care facility, committed to paying the student and providing a quality learning experience.
- Students are registered as a domestic student and have a <u>Work-Integrated Learning component</u> as part of their program of study or course.
- Placement cannot be funded by another source of federal funding.
- Full eligibility requirements: https://swpp.magnet.today/







Participating in the Magnet SWP Program

Once an application has been submitted, Magnet will review and respond with 1-2 weeks.

Should an application be approved, funding will be conditional on completing the following during and after the placement:

- Signing an employer placement agreement
- Uploading proof of payroll for the student
- Completing a vendor form with Ryerson University for payment
- Uploading the final pay stub issued to the student
- Uploading an invoice for the subsidy amount awarded

On successful completion of these items, the subsidy will be processed within 45 days.
